

- ACF retained Charitable Ventures in 2024 to conduct Needs Assessments in the community for Youth and Families as well as Older Adults to research and identify the needs and priorities of Anaheim residents.
- ACF will continue to serve as the lead convener to drive collaborative progress in numerous areas: ACT Anaheim (multi-sector youth resiliency collaborative); Anaheim Human Servies Network (be a go-to resource for 400+ nonprofit representatives); and the annual ImpACT Anaheim Giving Day to raise funds for underserved youth.
- **ACF** will leverage its leadership as Anaheim's hub for philanthropy to grow Community Impact grants by seeking additional funders and engaging more donors to assist in our mission.
- **ACF** will continue to explore options for permanent office space that may also serve as a "Hive" to provide offices and meeting space for Anaheim nonprofit organizations.

Helping Hands Grants

The Christopher K. Jarvi Helping Hands grant program focuses on strengthening youth, residents, and community through supporting community-based organizations. Named after our founding Executive Director, the Anaheim Community Foundation awarded \$50,000 to 39 nonprofit organizations who served Anaheim residents in 2023. These grants funded vital programs with a wide range of impact. These services included water safety instruction, foster youth mentoring, career planning and workforce development, support to individuals



and families experiencing homelessness, arts classes, veteran support, family therapy, and food distribution. All recipients of Helping Hands grants will positively impact the quality of life for Anaheim residents in need.

Led by the Anaheim Community Foundation, Accelerating Change Together Anaheim is a collaboration of cross-sector partners focused on youth resiliency. This collaborative has been highly effective and is currently working on addressing the impact of Covid-19 on our young people.

Thanks to a \$1 Million Federal Grant, our ACT partners are bringing preventative mental health programs to Anaheim schools. In the first 4 months of this funding, over 5,000 youth have already participated in programs, activities, and services to improve their mental health.



Partnerships

\$300,000 Awarded to Enhance Services for Anaheim's Homeless

The Anaheim Community Foundation (ACF) selected City Net and Covenant House as the recipients of \$150,000 grants to provide services to support Anaheim's homeless. The funding was provided by the former Anaheim Interfaith Shelter/Halcyon organization. Over 45 organizations submitted grant applications and a panel comprised of ACF Board members, City of Anaheim staff and Halcyon Board members made the selection.

City Net will utilize the funds for a Mobile Response vehicle with facilities for client care and case management. This asset will elevate City Net's capacity to onboard and sustain progress with clients in every corner of Anaheim.

Covenant House California Continuum for Youth will provide safe shelter beds, age-appropriate assessments, intensive and thoughtful case management, crisis intervention, home-cooked meals, physical and mental healthcare linkages, that stabilizes youth who have experienced trauma as a result of homelessness and, often, trauma that caused their homelessness.



Store One, a new public-private initiative being developed by the City of Anaheim and fiscally sponsored by the Anaheim Community Foundation, is bringing together a diverse set of stakeholders from throughout Anaheim to transform the site of the original Northgate González Market into a vibrant culinary community center. Opening in late 2025, this visionary project will convene nonprofit and educational partners to offer entrepreneurship and workforce development programs geared toward the culinary and hospitality industry,

as well as community health and wellness services that will focus on the rich cuisine, character, and cultural history of the neighborhood.

Store One stakeholders have designed the programs to meet the current challenges and opportunities in Anaheim and to be well positioned to serve the growing demands of the industry in the years to come.

The 12,393 square foot facility will feature three commercial kitchens, an indoor multi-purpose space, a pop-up café and retail area, and an outdoor gathering space for the community.

With the ACF's engagement, Store One will become a launching pad and community hub -- uplifting and reinvigorating the neighborhood.

A Special Tribute **Irv Pickler Tree Planting**

In September, the Foundation planted a tree at Pearson Park in memory of Irv Pickler, former Anaheim City Council and ACF Board member. We were honored to have his son Don, grandson Brian, daughter-inlaw Noel Pickler, and many of his friends from the Kiwanis and ACF Board in attendance.

Anaheim Community Impact Grants

The Anaheim Community Foundation, in partnership with the Samueli Foundation, awarded \$360,000 in Anaheim Community Impact Grants (ACIG) in 2023. This cross-sector collaboration is dedicated to meeting the needs of Anaheim residents through existing community resources. The purpose of this fund is to bolster and enhance the efforts of the city by addressing the needs of the community by providing services for residents in Anaheim and to build the capacity of the nonprofit sector by engaging in conversations and collaborations among cross sector entities.

2023 Funded Projects

- Anaheim Public Library system \$100,000 Project based programming as researched and directed by library staff at seven library branches (Central, Haskett, Ponderosa, Euclid, Sunkist, Canyon Hills, and East Anaheim).
- Love Anaheim- \$120,000 Purchase of a Choice Market Truck that provides fresh fruits/vegetables and a variety of food to Seniors and others in need.
- Kid Healthy \$25,000 Padres en Acción/ Parents In Action, an innovative parentled active recess and health education program at Ponderosa Elementary School and Family Resource Center.



- Latino Health Access \$20,000 Latino Health Access will partner with the Edison Park community to bring health, equity, and sustainable change through education, services, consciousness-raising, and civic participation.
- **Muckenthaler Cultural Center** \$20,000 Arts programming for Seniors at West Anaheim and Teens at the Brookhurst Teen Center.
- **Project SAY** \$25,000 Youth programming enhancement at each of the six teen center spaces for the purposes of gaming, educational, recreational, leadership, and special event/excursion outings and experiences.
- RYTMO \$50,000 Training, development and employment program for teens and adults served by non-profits: My Day Counts, Creative Identity and Cancer Kinship. Teens and adults served by these organizations will receive the RYTMO curriculum, a year-long, multi-session education.

Anaheim Human Services Network



The Anaheim Human Services Network serves as a networking platform for the sharing of information and resources between service agencies to strengthen the overall provision of service delivery and support to Anaheim residents. The network meets the first Wednesday of every month and brings together 80+ community and non-profit agencies monthly. In partnership with the Anaheim Human Services Network and Network Anaheim, the Anaheim Community Foundation co-hosts these meetings. Together, we provide useful links, information, and resources to benefit the Anaheim Community.

Tech Scholar Program Returns

The Anaheim Tech Scholar program provided 15 laptop computers and up to two years of free internet access to upper level high school students from the 11 public and private high schools in Anaheim. The program aims to support high school students who have historically been under-represented by providing them with laptops to bridge the digital divide.

Access to technology is crucial for educational and professional advancement, especially for high school students with college ambitions. By offering laptops, students can overcome barriers and enhance their digital literacy skills, enabling them to pursue educational opportunities, job prospects, and overall socioeconomic growth. Through this initiative, we hope to create a more equitable society by addressing the disparities that exist in technology access and fostering greater opportunities for under-represented communities.

ImpACT Anaheim Giving Day

On July 26, 2023, the Anaheim Community Foundation brought together 10 nonprofit organizations to raise \$217,417 from 387 donors in support of underserved youth in Anaheim. The Foundation raised an amazing \$37,579 from 73 donors. Disneyland Half Marathon Weekend

The Anaheim Community Foundation was selected as a participating charity for the return of the Disneyland Half Marathon Weekend! 99 runners joined Team Helping Hands to help raise funds and support grants for local nonprofit organizations providing vital services in mental health, food insecurity, water-safety, literacy, emergency shelter, college readiness and more. Team Helping Hands raised over \$50,000!

State of the City Luncheon

The Anaheim Community Foundation was honored to host the 2023 State of the City Luncheon at the City National Grove of Anaheim on May 23, 2023. Centered on the theme of "We Are Anaheim", Mayor Ashleigh Aitken talked about how Anaheim neighborhoods are seeing renewal and a focus on services touching the daily lives of residents as the city's record economic recovery continues.



As the beneficiary of the event, the Anaheim Community Foundation received \$75,000 in proceeds and awarded 100% of the funds to an array of programs, services and other nonprofits, all to enrich the lives of Anaheim residents and our community.

ANAHEIM COMMUNITY FUNDS

Highlighted Funds

The Concerts in the Canyon series consists of four concerts at Ronald Reagan Park. Concerts began on June 29th and were scheduled on Thursday evenings through July 27th. The bands featured this year included "Kelly Rae Band" country hits, "Kings of 88" piano rock tribute, "Undercover" today's top hits and dance music and "The Trip" rock hits from the 60's to now. These concerts are well established and have an average attendance of 1,300 people weekly.

This is the second year of this series at Maxwell Park and consists of two concerts. They were held on Thursday evenings, August 3rd and 10th. The bands featured this year were "Smokin" Cobras," an oldies tribute band, and "4 Alarm Band," performing 80's to today's rock music. Each week we saw approximately 400-500 attendees at the concerts.

All concerts featured food trucks, games and crafts put on by the Youth Programs staff and additional sponsor booths.



PEARSON PARK

The Pearson Park Amphitheatre has been a staple of entertainment for families and friends for many years. This beloved venue has hosted a variety of family shows. This past summer, the fun continued with entertainment that included Le Polynesia, Anaheim Ballet, and Buster Balloon. Average attendance at these shows was approximately 600-800 people.

Along with family shows, Pearson Park Amphitheatre hosted three summer night concerts. Bands this past summer included "SantanaWays" a Carlos Santana tribute band, "Trinity" 80's rock tribute band, and "Britishmania" a Beatles tribute band. The average attendance for these bands was about 1,500-1,800 people.





OAK CANYON NATURE CENTER Summer Nature Nights has been a tradition for 46 years, open to individuals of all ages at no cost. The evening starts with a guided hike led by our naturalist, allowing participants to fully immerse themselves in the beauty of the outdoors and discover the wonders of our local flora and fauna. Each week features engaging presentations led by field experts, covering topics such as birds of prey, wolves, and astronomy, which ensured attendees an unforgettable experience. Donations to OCNC support our tradition of offering the community a unique nature-based program. Last summer, over 2,200 participants attended.
